CSW 64 although cancelled this March because of COVID 19, has not been finalised as yet and the committee for CSW 65 scheduled for March 2021 has not been decided. We had the largest contingent of SISWP Soroptimists scheduled to attend CSW 64 when cancellation of CSW64 was announced by UN Women on the 3rd March not leaving much time to cancel flights and accommodation.

Most canceled their attendance but some from SI Morton North continued to New York and attended a reduced opening session on Monday the 9th March before traveling on to other destinations Such as life! Hopefully provided COVID 19 will have run its course, although it seems unlikely at this stage, CSW65 should occur next March.

During the pandemic some clubs such as SI Kemang are actively supporting their communities in particular ways. I understand that SI Kemang is distributing batches of medical equipment to hospitals, other Malaysian clubs are providing shelf stable foods to hospitals. In my own suburb in Canberra a community pantry has been developed to help those who have been stood down from their jobs, jobs that involve large closely associated groups of people like restaurants and picture theatres and are now without an income until government support is provided in the next few weeks. It has been a very different world these last few months since the disease was identified in China and one way of helping is to assist as my local community is doing with its "Street Pantry". This "pantry" looks just like a phone box with shelves for the donated foodstuffs. Hopefully the corona pandemic will be contained this year but in the meantime many people will need help with food and medical equipment so help out where you can.

The Programme Team was delighted with the large number of nominations for Best Practice awards for 2019, and these will be announced at the Conference of Clubs in Yogyakarta rescheduled to November later this year. It would seem that most clubs have taken to the new database to record their projects, activities, and donations. Keep up the good work.

23rd April - **International Girls ICT Day** this year is celebrated 23 rd April. Why Girls in ICT Day? There are job opportunities in ICT, the number of female technical students is low, because the sector is male dominated. Now many companies realise that diversity in the workforce positively impacts financial performance and are looking to increase the number of women represented in the sector. Supporting education of women and girls in ICT is also in line with the SDG goals particularly SDG5 to achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls and achieve full and effective participation and equal opportunities for leadership at all levels of decision making.

15th May each year is the **International Day of Families**. This day encourages awareness of issues relating to families and to increase the knowledge of those issues affecting families particularly.

Programme Team Reports

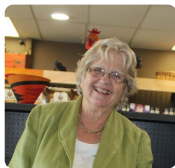
This biennium is fast drawing to a close, this month the programme team present their final reports. Some will be leaving their positions whilst others will be staying on.

As reported in last month's eSPAN, work was to commence on the Generation Equality Forum's - Realizing Women's Rights For a Equal Future, both of these forums scheduled for 2020 have now been cancelled. The key objectives of the Forum were to chart forward a fresh and bold feminist agenda and to launch a set of '[Action Coalitions](#)' that will allow to achieve tangible results on gender equality during the [UN Decade of Action](#) (2020-2030) to deliver the Sustainable Development Goals. The NGO CSW group have produced a fact sheet Recommendations to be implemented based on the Six Thematic Groups. The Thematic Groups are - Participation, Climate Crisis, Freedom from Violence, Poverty Eradication, Peaceful and Inclusive Societies, Inclusive Development. "Finally, the NGO CSW/NY Beijing + 25 Study Group asks for the political will of Member States, the UN, the private sector and NGOs to make our recommendations/asks/demands a reality. We intend to organize, educate and make enough noise to implement the Beijing Platform for Action and CEDAW." Around the Federation

This month we focus on the work clubs are doing to assist where they can whilst in lockdown. Two of the projects featured here are ongoing and rely on the continued donation of funds, if your club can assist please contact the clubs directly to talk about how you can send funds.

SI Petaling Jaya - Food Packs

We are into our third week of lockdown in Malaysia. Whilst we understand the need to stay at home, the sisters of SI Petaling Jaya also recognised a greater need emerging in this time of crisis.

It is one thing to remain at home whilst you are still drawing a salary, or wages or able to live off savings. It is quite another to be a daily wage earner where no work means no pay which translates into no food. Last year our club supported 3 children's shelters and one refugee centre with our shoebox project. We were unable to replicate the project this year due to the Movement Order Constraints. What we decided to do instead was raise funds and ensure that these families and children received food until the end of lockdown, funds permitting. The 3 shelter homes comprise a total of 36 children; 13 young children, 10 teenage girls and 13 teenage boys. There are 61 children at the refugee centre who form 51 families. Our deepest gratitude goes out to all those who donated to this worthy cause. Here of some pictures of our activities over the past three weeks.





SI Bayside - Care Packs

Looking after our front line workers and families and children in lockdown. Care Packs were made up and delivered to the Redlands Hospital, and then the following week, delivered Care Packs to the clients of Maybanke (Redlands women's DV refuge) last week, followed up by a third delivery a delivery of toys, games, books and puzzles to help the families at Maybanke. All these items were donated by SI Bayside members. The staff were delighted and so glad to get them in time to distribute before Easter. These last packs contained some Easter chocolate treats as well.



SI Ipoh - Care Packs

SI Ipoh answered a call for shortage of toiletries, medical supplies, diapers etc by MPKSM Ipoh Rumah Sejahtera Jelapang, an old folks home with 39 residents. In times like this, it is not convenient for our senior friends to stand in long queues to buy basic necessities. They all just want to keep healthy and stay home.

Thank you to Billion Supermarket Jelapang for delivering these items to them.



SI Penang - MCO Frontline Project.
