FROM OUR PROGRAMME CONVENOR



Happy New Year 2023 and for Chinese New Year on 22 January. There are many exciting things planned across our 13 countries, now 131 clubs and more than 2,300 members. We expect to action our 5 Federation themes and implement our new strategic plan, while rebuilding after covid and strengthening our relationships locally and globally. **Thank you for all clubs** submitting their reports by 31 December 2022, which shows our productivity.

We are pleased to be part of the global policy and impact negotiations in ways like CSW67 Commission for the Status of Women (UN NY), IWD, G7 invitations to connect with Civil7 and Y7 for youth under 30, Environment, adult literacy, voice for the girl child, 16 Days eliminating violence against women, and Human Rights. This also allows us to amplify our 5 federations together on special topics like Education, SDGs and gender equality in many forms. In our own 13 countries, we are **advancing after covid in many measures** including law and policy for gender equality, multiplying impact of empowered women, better transparency (less corruption so money goes to the right places), and leapfrogging technology so vulnerable people are better informed to make their own decisions. Our Programme team monitors trends so our advocacy and projects can have more impact in the right ways.

Soroptimist International **educates**, empowers and enables females to realise true potential. It is widely demonstrated that:

- education is the key for escaping **poverty** - for a girl, woman, family, community and a country
- education is the pathway for **empowerment** and **choice** as an informed citizen, as highly skilled worker or entrepreneur or advocate or ethical politician

- **community education** underpins social cohesion and resilience capacity in adverse situation like conflict, disasters or disease. Informed citizens are powerful for prevention and recovery.

So, ensuring girls and women have a chance to be educated in basic, intermediate or advanced skills and knowledge, is the **wisest long-term investment**. For international aid and development, investing in women's education provides the quickest results for a country to become stronger (OECD and IWDA). Furthermore, educating girls is the key for **doubling GDP** for whole countries, as women assume gender-equal-futures.

Sustainable Development Goal 4 is to ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all, with **seven targets**, three means of implementation. We are especially pleased with the number of **scholarships** for students and **bursaries** for education expenses, as well as **donations** towards more school supplies and operations. We also acknowledge the **temporary schools** that set up in emergencies from floods, fires, cyclones and earthquakes across our federation as we help parents and children find some routine and learning during those difficult times.

SI Singapore National President Report

It is my honour to present my first report in my new role as National President of Singapore. Singapore is a small island city-state and we have **three Soroptimist Clubs**.

A highlight to start off our term was the official visit of SI South East Asia Pacific (SISEAP) President Christine Johnstone. Her presence was timely to grace the occasion of the anniversary celebrations of two of our clubs: SI (Singapore) **Garden City** in its

16th year and SI (Singapore) **Orchid** in its 6th year. Christine also held meetings with each club individually to discuss issues and provide valuable guidance.

Singapore was also honoured by the visit of SISEAP President-Elect Joanne Yeoh. Joanne put together an excellent presentation about Soroptimism for an audience of members, guests and prospective members. A special session was held for a gathering of interested Young Persons with a view to forming a new Club, Singapore's first Young Adults Club as we aim to increase our membership and target younger members.

With the relaxation of strict COVID-19 restrictions, our Clubs are slowly **resuming in-person projects**. These include the Sree Narayana Mission Nursing Home for the Elderly (SI Garden City) amongst others.

Advocacy related to violence against women continues through our clubs' support in their capacity as members of the Singapore Council of Women's Organizations (SCWO). After months of discussions and gleaning feedback from both men and women and members of the SCWO, the Singapore Government released its **White Paper on Singapore Women's Development**. The White Paper on Singapore Women's Development reflects the Singapore government's shared vision towards a fairer and more inclusive society, where men and women partner each other as equals, and both can pursue their aspirations freely and to the fullest.

The year-long, nationwide Conversations on **Singapore Women's Development** that engaged nearly **6000 participants over 160 conversations** took stock of the current efforts to empower, uplift and support women and gave voice to the collective aspirations for Singapore women, resulting in **25 collective action plans by the Government and community**. Some of these action plans include equality in the work place, towards a fairer and more inclusive society, equality in the family, protection of women against violence and harm and many more.

Thank you to all the Clubs that were able to submit their information into the Programme Reporting Database by 31st December 2022. The Programme Team is now processing this data so that everything will be finalized by the end of January 2023. Once this is completed Clubs will be able to download their Annual Reports. Also Reports for submission to the UN and other agencies will be able to be undertaken using the data you have provided.

You can still enter activities undertaken in 2022 into the Programme Reporting Database, however some of this may not be captured for the numerous reports currently being prepared but will be on record for use at a later date. **Remember you can Re-use** previously published Reports, so if you have an activity, you undertake every year, Re-use the previous report, and **update it with current dates** and information. You can also RE-use a Rejected Report and use this as a basis to improve and change your Report.

The attachment of **photos to Projects** has been fixed. This includes images and also PDF's, so if you have a Project outline or feedback- this can also be attached as a PDF. This is only available for Projects.

The new SEAP Web page provides a Quick Link from the Members Home page to PROGRAMME. This will give you a range of Help documents and access to the Programme

database. Or you can enter the URL <https://www.reports-siswp.org> to go direct to the Logon page for the Database.

SI Brisbane Water - 16 Days Action

SI Brisbane Water members joined with around 300 people who marched through Gosford on Wednesday, December 7, demanding action on putting an end to domestic and family violence. Coast Shelter CEO Michael Starr said, " the event heralded the end of the United Nations' 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence, an annual international campaign that concludes on December 10.

"This is really all about raising awareness on the Central Coast around the scourge of domestic and family violence and gender-based violence," he said.

Starr said statistics showed that the problem was not improving in the region, which has alarmingly high domestic violence incidences. "This issue is at the heart of our community," "We are a smart and wealthy community in a smart and wealthy nation and yet we still have women's safety at the top of our social issues.

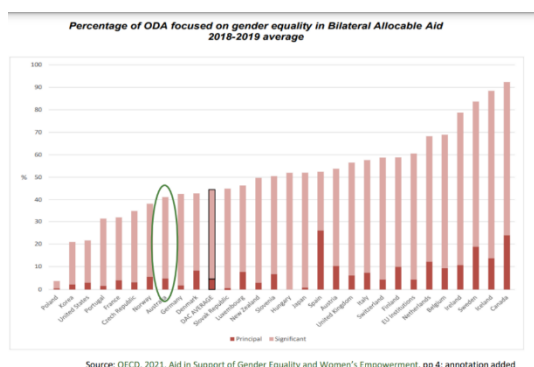
"It is not good enough. "When you see the number of children under the age of 12 with their mums in our crisis refuges it breaks your heart. We had over 40 children in our refuges just last night and that trauma sticks with these kids all their lives."

This sums up the issue for many communities throughout our Federation. We must never stop being visible and raising awareness,.



SI Nelson - 16 Days Action

Feminist Foreign Policy & Funding Fairer Futures

Around the world donor countries are being urged to report on their impact on women, girls families and communities.

The little red parts at the bottom is the amount that countries can trace to investment into women. (Source: OECD, IWDA 2022)

In Australia, the new government requested input from Soroptimists to frame a new foreign

policy which we concentrated on impact on women, girls, families and communities. We addressed implementing Soroptimist International Position Statements. [HERE](#) **Fairer Feminist Futures**

However, other countries have completely changed how funding is decided - Sweden Norway Finland, Canada, Germany (in progress), European Union, Australia (in progress), New Zealand (in Progress). Despite Australian Prime Minister Julia Gillard is the global champion, along with New Zealand's Helen Clark, their initiatives were stalled for a decade. Pilot programs have been successful, especially in projects in the Pacific.



Housing older women is a special topic for all our countries, as the second greatest hidden epidemic. The **right to shelter is a basic human right** (since 1948) but it is being eroded. The quickest increase in **homelessness** is in Older women, so it is important that we address the triggers that cause this as well as provide safe short-term and long-term shelter.

Soroptimists are always involved in helping others, not just in natural disasters, or violent situations, or covid circumstances, but in economic hardship too. Soroptimists step up when someone is in harm's way - danger, disaster or disease. **The diagram above** shows both positive and negative impact of policy impacts. Sometimes the best ways forward is to multiply impact by having a suite of policies that meet special community needs.

SI South Queensland Region has ongoing participation in decision-making bodies for the next decade addressing the housing crises. This way Soroptimists can advocate for honourable legacies from the investments into the 2032 Olympics and Paralympics in SEQ.

This long-term advocacy will be part of President Maureen's SDG presentation to UN in July 2023.

Projects in this area over the **past 3 years will be reviewed** in the coming month. This will guide us on how to be more effective in future. Watch this space.



SI Damasara - Building Bridges Beyond Borders

BBB is an educational collaboration between Just Volunteers! (UK) and SI Damansara where international students from various universities overseas and local university students are placed in homes/learning centres under SID's support to provide teaching and mentoring support to local underprivileged children, orphans and refugees. In 2022 alone, 1000 girls and 28 women were educated and supported in many ways.

Although this is an ongoing project with 5 refugees schools and supplementary support systems, it is still worthy of our appreciation for the voluntary efforts and strong ongoing partnerships.
